Tennis/Pickleball Courts

What is pickleball exactly? For the uninitiated, pickleball is something of a mix between tennis, racquetball and ping pong. Players use special paddles and a wiffle ball, and games take place on tennis courts with specific pickleball lines. Nets and court sizes are smaller than their tennis counterparts, and the most common game is doubles, although singles is also an option. It has its own set of quirky rules — for instance, try to stay out of the "kitchen" — but they're easy to learn. The game appeals for several reasons. "For one, it's very social, "You'll see a big mix of demographics out there. It is a mental component. "You need to out-think your opponent so there's a lot of strategy that goes into playing. The game is also quick, making it a convenient way to get in some exercise. Games in a typical league run only 15 minutes each — you can get in as little or as much as you want. People have worn their fitness tracker when playing and after two hours, they have moved the equivalent of four miles of walking. But the nice thing is that if you're playing doubles, you can get in a workout without killing yourself.



Pickleball is for everyone it is a great family sport. Anyone can play, from eight-year olds up to 100-year olds. It's great for hand-eye coordination for younger kids. So try out our Courts which can be reserved anytime between 8 am to 8 pm by calling the Pro Shop at 252-946-3245.

Did You Know...

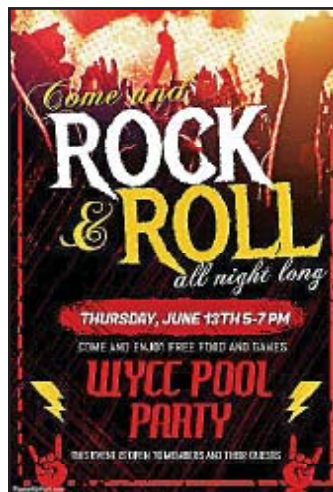
